4.2 Computerization of administration and library

- OPAC: online public access catalogue facility is available in the library. Staff and students have been given training for using the OPAC.

The library has unlimited broadband internet browsing facility. The library has legal software like Windows XP, library software and Microsoft office 2007. The **Library Manager software** helps in monitoring the users.

1] News papers clipping service: To make them aware of what is happening in their concerned field.

2] New arrival display: This regular exercise helps the students and staff to know the books added in a particular subject in a particular year.

3] Exhibition on special days: On special days like Gathering Function. Books are exhibited to create awareness among the students community. Apart from this, the books of VIP visitors, who visit the college, are maintained.

4] Resource Sharing CAS(Current Awareness Service)

5] Reference Services: Services are provided for most effective use of resources. Reference collection in the library is vast and varied. All users are free to use the library to refer books and to satisfy their thirst for knowledge. All the reference resources are easily accessible to the library users.

6] Other Services : The library services is computerized. The entire functioning is automated with Library Manager software. Cataloguing, Circulation, Housekeeping (For stock checking) and Serial control sections are computerized. The multilingual search of entire library collection is accessible to the users through Web OPAC. The processing of books with barcode labels is taken up through the software.

The library staff including the Librarian and supporting staff are always at the service of the students and staff in accessing of books. Support to getting the books issued and returned, communication about last date for renewals are also provided. Students are motivated with Library Orientation programme at the beginning of the academic year.

For procuring of the books, the library staff takes suggestions and recommendations of the faculty members and briefs the management about the appropriate needs of the library. The journals are procured after studying the need for respective departments by reaching out to the distributors nationwide. Students are supported with dissertation material to help them in projects.
